## Pope Francis entrusts China to Blessed Virgin Mary

Pope Francis entrusted China to the Blessed Virgin Mary on May 24, and asked people to pray for a new outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the most populated country in the world.

“Dear Catholic brothers and sisters in China, I wish to assure you that the universal Church, of which you are an integral part, shares your hopes and supports you in trials,” Pope Francis said May 24 after the Regina Caeli prayer.

“It accompanies you with prayer for a new outpouring of the Holy Spirit, so that the light and beauty of the Gospel, the power of God for the salvation of whoever believes, can shine in you,” the pope said.

Pope Francis imparted a special Apostolic Blessing upon China for the feast of Our Lady Help of Christians. The Marian shrine of Sheshan in Shanghai, which is dedicated to Our Lady Help of Christians, remains closed on this feast after the Diocese of Shanghai

suspended all pilgrimages for the month of May to prevent the spread of the coronavirus.

“We entrust the pastors and faithful of the Catholic Church in that great country to the guidance and protection of our Heavenly Mother, so that they may be strong in faith and firm in fraternal union, joyful witnesses and promoters of charity and fraternal hope, and good citizens,” Pope Francis said.

“May Our Lady always guard you!” he added.

In his Regina Caeli address, the pope reflected on the words of Jesus recorded in Gospel

of Matthew for the feast of the Ascension of the Lord: “Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.”

China is home to more than 10 million Catholics, with six million registered as members of the Chinese Catholic Patriotic Association, according to official statistics.

The Holy See and the Chinese government signed a provisional agreement in 2018 on the appointment of bishops

in the state-sponsored Church, the terms of which have still not been publicly released. In the wake of the deal, previously excommunicated bishops of the Chinese Catholic Patriotic Association, which is overseen by the Communist Party, were received into full communion with the Vatican.

### Chinese Catholics suffering

A report published in 2020 by the U.S. China Commission found that Chinese Catholics suffered “increasing persecution” after the Vatican-China deal. It said the government was “demolishing churches, removing crosses, and continuing to detain underground clergy.” Priests and bishops have reportedly been detained or have gone into hiding.

It is unclear whether Catholics in China were able to use the most popular Chinese state-monitored social media platform, WeChat, to watch the livestream of this Sunday Marian prayer for their country due to the heavy censorship of all Chinese online media.

# Charity begins at home

I'm certainly glad that the "shelter in place" and the isolation seems to be coming to a gradual end. Covid 19 was suddenly upon us and we are now thrust into a "new normal."

Of course no matter what we do from now on, we should in true charity observe the proper "social distancing", facemasks, handwashing, and all the other things necessary to protect not only ourselves but others.

In retrospect, the last couple of months have been a time for reflection, prayer, and more intimate relationship with family without some of the stress of everyday life, such as calendars, appointments, and all the rest which makes our lives disorganized.

As I sit in isolation reading plaintiff emails from my pastor concerning the state of the parish, the quote: "Charity begins at home," comes to mind. It's apparent that my parish family is in need!

The quote: "Charity begins at home," is not

from the Bible. In fact, it has been accredited to several people as far back as an English satirist in the year 1610, and most recently to Charles Dickens in 1844. But in spite of not being an actual quote from the Bible, there certainly is good foundation for it there. In Timothy, Chapter 5, when speaking of rules for widows in the congregation, St. Paul

makes this statement: "... Whoever does not provide for relatives and especially family members has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever." Later, in Galatians, Chapter 6, St. Paul focuses his imperative more precisely when he says: "... While we have the opportunity, let us do good to all, but especially to those who belong to the family of the faith."

Here is a true opportunity for us to be charitable... in our own parish! There are several ways we can help as faithful members of our own Catholic communities:

First, many of our Church leaders are extremely concerned about

parishioners no longer coming to Mass at all in the future as a result of the long hiatus.

As you know there was already an exodus of Catholics from the Church prior to the pandemic. This situation is seen as only exacerbating that problem.

Also, from a financial perspective, it is obvious that if fewer people attend Mass, then fewer people will be supporting their local parishes. This not only means that the electricity bill doesn't get paid but that all of the social service ministries of the parish are no longer able to provide help, assistance

and care to those in need.

So, here is something to keep in mind: we can be proactive in protecting our faith by encouraging Mass attendance of our fellow Catholics.

We should encourage attendance by our family members but we can also encourage our friends and neighbors to go back to Mass.

We might even offer to take them with us when the social distancing has been lifted.

But most of all, we can encourage them by reflecting on the importance of our Lord's Real Presence in the Eucharist, which we have all so deeply missed over the last few months. What a

joyous homecoming it will be!

# Celebrate these Feast Days in June

## June 7 The Most Holy Trinity

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity celebrates the Christian doctrine of the Trinity, the three Persons of God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. It is considered one of the “mysteries of our faith, and will not be fully understood until we enter heaven, when we are in union with Christ. The doctrine was first introduced in the 9th century, and added to general calendar in the 14th century by Pope John XXII.

## June 14 The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

The feast of Corpus Christi is a Christian liturgical solemnity celebrating the Real Presence of the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ in the elements of the Eucharist. The feast was proposed by St. Thomas Aquinas, in order to create a feast focused solely on the Holy Eucharist. It is celebrated on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday or, “where the Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is not a holy day of obligation, it is assigned to the Sunday after the Most Holy Trinity as its proper day”.

## June 19 The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

In the Catholic Church, the month of June is dedicated to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. The feast day falls 19 days after Pentecost, on a Friday. The devotion to the Sacred Heart, takes Jesus Christ’s physical heart as the representation of His Divine Love for humanity. In the devotion, Jesus asks the faithful to receive Communion regularly (especially on the First Friday of each month), go to confession monthly, and to venerate an image of his Sacred Heart, with prayers & sacrifices offered out of love for Him.

## June 20 The Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The Immaculate Heart of Mary is a devotion to the interior life of the Blessed Virgin Mary, her joys and sorrows, her virtues and hidden perfections, and, above all, her virginal love for God the Father, her maternal love for her son Jesus, and her compassionate love for all people. The aim of the devotion is to unite humankind to God through Mary’s heart, and this process involves the ideas of consecration and reparation. St. Francis de Sales spoke of the perfections of this heart, the model of love for God.

The second of the month apparitions may be over for Mirjana, but that doesn't mean that Our Lady's work is done, nor is Mirjana's mission for unbelievers. On the contrary, the world needs our prayers now more than ever.


Although Mirjana remains sad that she will not be having these monthly apparitions any longer, she has begun praying the rosary at 9 a.m. on the 2nd of every month.

Mirjana's longtime translator and local pilgrimage guide Miki Musa—who was responsible for writing down and translating Our

Lady's messages when Mirjana recounted them after each apparition—proposed the idea of joining in prayer on the second of every month in honor of Our Lady's mission for unbelievers.
