Rest in Peace Mr. Ferrario!

Radio Maria founder dies July 8; leaves legacy of world-wide evangelization

A Rite of Christian Burial was held July 11 for Emanuele Ferrario, the founder of Radio Maria, in his hometown of Varese, Italy, and live-streamed on Radio Maria USA. Ferrario passed away July 8 at the age of 90.

At the news of his death, hundreds of messages poured in from around the world, calling him an “extraordinary man,” and a “holy man who carried out a project of divine nature.”

“I knew Mr. Ferrario as a very humble, holy man,” said Carlo DiMaggio, president of Radio Maria USA. “He was a leader and a businessman, but he always carried a Rosary in his pocket and always stopped at noon to pray the Angelus. His

devotion to Our Blessed Mother was the driving force in his life, and it all started when he first went to Medjugorie in 1984.”

Ferrario was born on March 11, 1930 as the second child of Piero, a dairy merchant and Piera, a teacher. He grew up

with his family in Busto Arsizio and attended the parish of San Michele and the oratory. An altar boy and head of the altar boys, he was fascinated by the testimonials of the missionaries who came to the oratory on Sundays although he soon came to understand that his vocation would be that of a layman at the service of the Church.

He graduated in accounting in 1948 and began working in Varese on that same day in a company in the dairy sector, becoming a partner at his family’s express request.

On April 7, 1957, during a trip to the mountains, he met his wife Anna. On December 27 of the following year, they married

and moved to Varese.

After their wedding, Anna, who had worked in her father's company, devoted her life to being a full-time mother for their four children. In the spring of 1984, it was discovered that Anna had an incurable tumor and she died a few months later on October 26 at the age of 48.

A month earlier, Emanuele and his cousin, Fr. Giovanni, a missionary in Uganda, decided to go to Medjugorje. That trip proved to be a very strong experience in Emanuele's life. In fact, when he heard about a parish radio station called Radio Maria in Arcellasco d'Erba in 1986 that transmitted the messages of Medjugorje, he offered his collaboration, wishing to volunteer his



free time.

He promoted the foundation of an association as an organ for Radio Maria's activities and became its president from its foundation in 1987 until 2016.

At the same time as working as an entrepreneur, in just three years he expanded this parish

radio to become one of the largest and most listened to private radio stations in Italy.

In 1994, he began to take Radio Maria to other countries around the world. Then, in 1998, he founded the World Family of Radio Maria non-profit, which today brings together 81 Radio Maria stations

in 74 countries around the world. He served as the World Family's president from the year of its foundation until 2015.

Very attached to the Mater Ecclesiae Monastery on the island of San Giulio in Lake Orta, he became a Benedictine Oblate on December 27, 2000.

Emanuele worked incessantly and with a great spirit of sacrifice until the last day of his earthly life to fully realize the Radio Maria Project in the world, encouraging and guiding all of us working together on that project.

He was an example of humility and tenacity in the faith and will be remembered by all as a tireless missionary at the service of the Church and the Virgin Mary.

Radio Maria celebrates 20th anniversary!

On May 25, 2000, the first broadcast of Radio Maria on KJMJ 580 AM was made from the small studio on Washington Street in Alexandria, La.

Father Theophilus Herlong, from the Diocese of Lake Charles, La., was the first priest director for Radio Maria, and may have been the first to say "Welcome listeners to the first broadcast of Radio Maria -- a Christian voice in your home!"

Father Herlong and Joe Bertel, the president of RM back then, were instrumental in quickly securing frequencies in Lake Charles, New Iberia, and Natchitoches, La.; and Beaumont, Texas. Hundreds of men, women, teens and children in those areas stepped up as prayer leaders on the air, mailout volunteers,



phone volunteers in the studio and during marathons, computer data input volunteers, and as presenters. Those not actively volunteering were generously supporting the station with donations.

In 2004, the position of priest director was taken over by Fr. Duane Stenzel, a Franciscan priest who served from 2004 - 2011. It was under his direction, and national president Mary Pyper, that Radio Maria expanded its frequencies into four more states, including Anna, Dayton, and Springfield, Ohio; Holidaysburg, Pa., Peshtigo, Wisc, and



D'Iberville, Miss.

In 2011, after the death of Fr. Duane, another Franciscan priest, Father Robert Young, was named priest director (2012-2015).

Under the leadership of Fr. Robert and National President Carlo DiMaggio, Radio Maria grew rapidly in listeners, donors, and volunteers. His program *The Divine Will*, is one of the all-time favorite programs of our listeners.

Following the retirement of Fr. Robert, there were several priest directors including Fr. John Tino (2015-2016), Fr.

Emilio Garreaud (2016-2019), Deacon Al Vacek (2019-2020), and most recently Fr. John Fletcher, our current priest director.

Since that first broadcast, Radio Maria USA has become a national network with 11 stations in Louisiana, Texas, Mississippi, Ohio, Wisconsin, and Pennsylvania.

Today, Radio Maria is part of the World Family of Radio Maria, the largest radio network in the world. It is listener-supported and operated by volunteers. It includes 81 stations in 74 countries and is broadcast in 65 different languages.

Signs from heaven brought Radio Maria to Alexandria

It was a sign from heaven.

Actually, it was two signs from heaven, that convinced a Philadelphia stranger in 1999 to locate a new Catholic radio station – Radio Maria – in Alexandria, Louisiana 20 years ago.

The stranger was Joe Bertels, and at the time, the national president of

Radio Maria. There was already an Italian RM station located in New York, but the time had come to establish an English-speaking station in the US.

It was too expensive to locate a station in NY, Philadelphia, or several other potential sites, so Radio Maria founder Emanuele Ferrario had asked Bertels to locate a station. There were sev-

eral possibilities available in Beaumont, Texas.

Bertels was on his way driving to Beaumont, when he kept hearing a voice say "Alexandria." He didn't understand the sudden urge to go to Alexandria, so he prayed to Our Lady and asked her for a sign, not voices, to do her Will. He decided to stop and check out a tower in Alexandria he had heard of and was shocked when he noticed the location of the towers (acutally in Pineville, a small city across the Red River from Alexandria) – at the intersection of Radio Road and Bayou Maria.

The signs seemed

providential! Bertels knew instantly it was a sign from Our Lady!

He found St. Francis Xavier Cathedral in downtown Alexandria, went inside, and prayed for two hours before the Blessed Sacrament. He had absolutely no contacts in Alexandria and had no idea who to contact about the towers. He asked Our Lady to send someone to him to show where to start. He stayed for the noon Mass.

After Mass, he left the church thinking, no one was coming. "Our Lady was suppose to send someone to help," he remembers thinking.

As he walked down the steps of the Cathedral, he noticed a car parked in front of the church. The car was reflecting the sun and Bertels had to shield his eyes before he could see to cross the street where his car was parked.

The man inside the car asked him, "Hey, how are you doing?"

"Can you help me?" asked Bertels.

"Who sent you?" asked the man.

"The Blessed Virgin Mary," said Bertels.

"Get in the car," said the man.

The man was Art Visconti, a devout Catholic man in the community,

who loved Our Blessed Mother, prayed constantly, went to Mass 2-3 times a day, and knew a lot of people in town.

Bertels and Visconti had a long lunch that day discussing the towers and Radio Maria. After spending several days in Alexandria and getting all of his questions answered, Bertels returned to Ferrario and shared with him the events as they happened. Ferrario agreed immediately that Alexandria was definitely something to consider.

A year later, on May 25, 2000, Radio Maria began broadcasting at KJMJ -- 580 AM.

'God's Country' embraces Radio Maria in Ohio

The sweet refrain of "Amazing Grace" were the first sounds of Radio Maria as it signed onto the airwaves from Anna, Ohio on June 15, 2006.

It could not have been a more perfect place. WHJM, 88.7 FM is situated right in the middle of what is known as "God's Country" and "The Land of the Cross-Tipped Churches".

There are 33 beautiful historic churches built by the Society of the Most Precious Blood. Radio Maria was enthusiastically and wholeheartedly embraced by the surrounding communities and espe-



cially Fr. Rick Neiberding, pastor of Saint Augustine, who became our local priest advisor.

A studio and office were quickly established in Minster, Ohio with many volunteers creating several fundraisers to support their new station.

Emmanuel Ferrario, founder of Radio Maria, visited from Italy and saw the love the people had for Jesus and Mary and remarked that "The Blessed Mother has been here for a very long time, it is time for Radio Maria to be here, too."

Two more stations were added which cover Springfield and Dayton. Local studios were established for each station and many new national programs were created by local presenters.

Dayton served as the national headquarters of Radio Maria USA from 2006-2012 with Mary Pyper as national president.

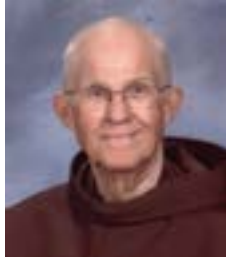

New Fatima movie opens Aug. 28 in local theatres

Moviegoers anticipating the feature film about the story of the children of Fátima will have to wait no longer. It opens in theatres nationwide Aug. 28.

The historical drama, directed by Marco Pontecorvo and distributed by Picturehouse, was originally scheduled for widespread release April 24, the second Friday of Easter. But like many films slated for this spring, "Fatima" was pushed back because of the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

Based on real-life events "Fatima" tells the story of Lúcia Santos, a young Portuguese girl, and her two younger cousins, Jacinta and Francisco Marto.

In 1917, the three young shepherds reported receiving visions of the Blessed Virgin Mary near the town of



Fátima. While the children's testament inspired thousands of believers, it also incited anger from government officials and put their lives at risk. Jacinta and Francisco, who fell victim to the global flu pandemic of 1918, were canonized in 2017.

While some distribution companies have opted to make their spring titles avail-

able via streaming "Fatima" has followed the path of blockbuster titles whose release dates have been delayed entirely.

Bob Berney, CEO of Picturehouse, told Angelus that once movie theaters announced widespread closures, "we really had no choice" but to reschedule release. "We really felt that

this movie is about community, and we believe that the theatrical experience is the best way to see the movie," he said.

According to Berney, the new release date was partially inspired by its proximity to the feast of the Assumption, which falls on Aug. 15.

A news release, summarizing the production of "Fatima," emphasizes the prominence of the story that turned a small Portuguese town into a major pilgrimage site.

"The power of its legacy has brought together an eclectic international group of cinema artists who believe that Fátima's miraculous message of faith and peace, which galvanized the world over a century ago, is more important than ever," the news release states.

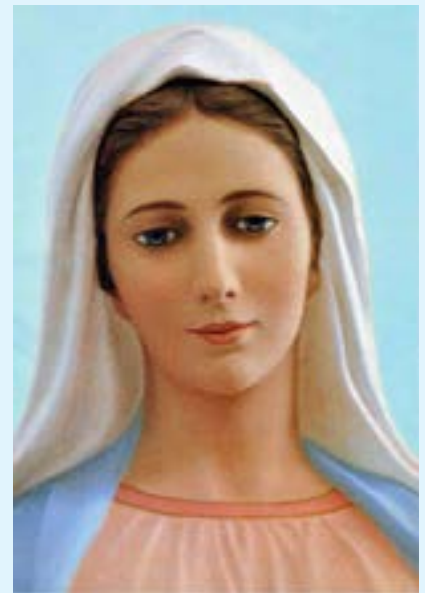
