Welcome our new national priest director, Fr. Dan Reehil

Radio Maria would like to welcome our new national priest director, Father Daniel “Dan” Reehil, from the Diocese of Nashville, Tenn.

Fr. Dan replaces Fr. John Fletcher, who served as interim priest director from June to August 2020.

“I am very excited about the opportunity to serve Radio Maria as the national priest director,” said Fr. Dan. “I look forward to the challenge ahead of me.”

As national priest director, Fr. Reehil will oversee the spiritual needs of the listeners through programming, will spearhead all fundraising and development activities and communication efforts, and will assist with all other aspects of the radio station.

Effective Dec. 1, he will begin presenting a weekly program “*Battle Ready*,” Tuesday-Friday,

at 9 a.m. CT/10 a.m. ET. Join him each day to hear him speak about the tools we need to fight the rising evil in the country today.

Father Dan was born in Mineola, NY in 1965, to parents Dan and Gladys. He is the oldest of four children. His father was a NYC Fire Chief and his mother was a court reporter after the children were in school.

After graduating from the University of Dayton, he worked in global trade and finance in Manhattan for American Express and Citicorp for 10 years, and then 3 years as the sales director of a corporate communications PR firm.

In 1998, Fr. Reehil made a pilgrimage to Medjugorje. This was a life-altering trip upon which he experienced a miraculous conversion after being away from the church for 20 years. This is where the seeds of his vocation to the priesthood

were planted when the priest who heard his 20-year confession told him that he believed he had a vocation to the priesthood.

Father began reflecting on the emptiness of his life and praying for God to lead him. After September 11, 2001 he left NYC and moved to Boston with a priest who invited him to come and see the life of diocesan priesthood. The priest, Fr. Tom DiLorenzo, was the greatest priestly role model Fr. Reehil has ever

experienced and it was in Boston that his formation to priesthood began.

He studied philosophy and theology at Holy Apostles Seminary but left before completing his studies to become a contemplative hermit in Omaha, NE. For five years he was formed in the radical life of the Evangelical Counsels of poverty, chastity and obedience. He then went back to seminary to finish his studies.

Near the end of his studies, he was invited to Nashville by the bishop to come and see Middle TN. Both Dan and the bishop agreed Nashville would be his new home.

He was ordained on July 26, 2014. He was assigned to St. Edward Parish as the Parochial Vicar and later pastor. He is currently the pastor of St. Catherine of Siena Parish in Columbia, TN.

10 things you may not know about Advent

2020 Season of Advent starts Sunday, November 29

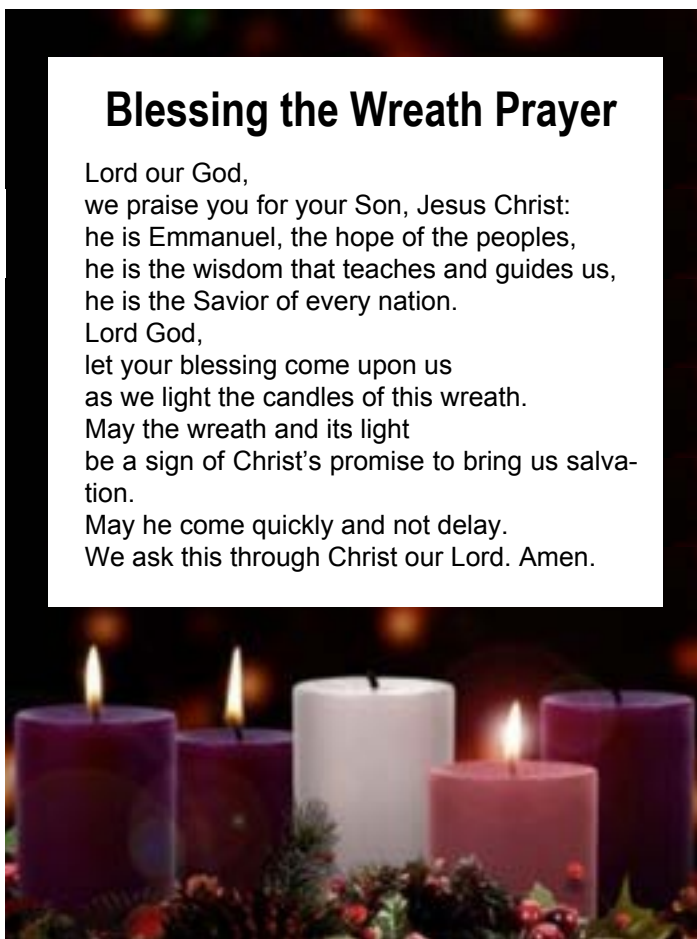
The season of Advent developed in the Church over time. Here are 10 facts that you may not know about the roots and meanings of Advent:

1. Advent is a time of expectation and preparation for the birth of the Lord. The word “Advent” derives from the Latin word “adventus,” which means “coming,” and is associated with the four weeks of preparation for Christmas.

2. Advent has a changing start date, but it always contains four Sundays. It starts on the Sunday closest to the feast of St. Andrew the Apostle (Nov. 30). It can begin as early as Nov. 27th or as late as Dec. 3.

3. Advent marks the beginning of the liturgical year. Advent was chosen to begin the year as representative of the time in history that Christ was not known to us. With His birth the beginning of our faith was founded. The liturgical year ends with the feast of Christ the King, His reign over the universe.

4. The Advent season has two meanings. It emphasizes both the celebration of Christ coming into the world as a man and also the second coming when the Lord

will return again. It blends together a penitential spirit, very similar to Lent, a liturgical theme of preparation for the Second and Final Coming of the Lord, called the Parousia, and a joyful theme of getting ready for the Bethlehem event. The traditional color of Advent is purple or violet, which symbolizes the penitential spirit. Religious traditions associated with Advent express all these themes.

5. Hope is a predominant theme of Advent. The Israelites hoped for a Messiah to come, and

Christ entered the world. We are hopeful for the arrival of Christ again into the world.

6. Advent is a reminder of the Old Testament promises of the coming of the Messiah. The Advent tradition of the Jesse Tree consists of symbols of the Messiah coming from the line of Jesse (Lk 3: 23-38). Isaiah is often read during this season to remember that we are waiting for the day when the Messiah will come again.

7. Advent focuses on light as opposed to darkness.

Christ enters our dark world and casts away the darkness of sin to redeem us. He will come again as the light of the world.

8. Advent has two parts. The first portion the First Sunday of Advent until Dec. 16 is preparation for the second coming of Christ. The second portion from Dec. 17 to 24 directly prepares us for the commemoration of the first coming of Christ, Christmas.

9. The origins of Advent can be traced back to the Church in France. In the 4th Century, the Church in France used the period before Epiphany as a time of preparation for baptism. It was called “St. Martin’s Lent” for the 40 days that started on Nov. 11, the feast of St. Martin of Tours.

10. Advent as we know today was developed in Rome. Pope Gregory I in the late 6th or early 7th Century composed many of the prayers, antiphons and psalm responses. Many themes and ideas we now know can be traced to the Roman Advent season.

Dec. 8 -- Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception

On Dec. 8, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, the solemn dogma defined by Blessed Pope Pius IX in 1854. As Our Lady Immaculately Conceived is the patroness of the United States of America, this is a holy day of obligation in the United States.



Through the centuries the Church has become ever more aware that Mary, “full of grace” through God, was re-

deemed from the moment of her conception. That is what the dogma of the Immaculate Conception confesses, as Blessed

Pope Pius IX proclaimed on December 8, 1854:

“The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Saviour of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin.” — Catechism of the Catholic Church

Significantly in the first reading, the liturgy recalls the figure of Eve,

the mother of all the living. The Fathers of the Church saw in Mary, the new Eve that unties the knot bound by the first woman. The knot of disobedience tied by Eve, was untied by the obedience of Mary. As Eve was created in purity and integrity, also the new Eve was miraculously preserved from the contamination of original sin because she had to give humanity the Word, who was incarnated for our ransom.

Radio Maria was born as a parish radio in 1983 in the Diocese of Milan, Italy. Its purpose was to keep parishioners informed and to help them through prayer, the daily Mass and the Rosary. But it quickly grew in popularity into other countries. Radio Maria began broadcasting from its first English-speaking station in the US on May 25, 2000 in Alexandria, La. It has since expanded to include 10 frequencies in five other states.

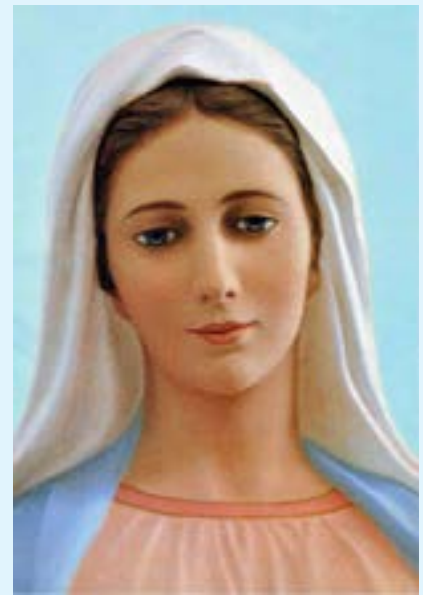

Therefore, little children, work on yourselves.
