charities that propagate the message and works of Jesus Christ.

When I was a transitional deacon, I preached a Sunday homily on tithing at the Cathedral where I was assigned. In the homily I said that to see how serious you are about your love and care for the Church, look at your calendar, your check book and your credit card statements. Where you put your time and money is what is most important to you. The rector of the Cathedral was not happy. He was afraid I had angered his big donors. I did not see why. If they were big donors, they should not take offense at the statement. But it is true. Where we put our time and money is where our treasure is!

Jesus himself said, "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." (Matt. 6:19-21)

Over time I have come to the realization that to give alms, to support the church - and the charities of God, we become the ones who are blessed the most. It is a way for us to participate in building up God's kingdom, and in



the process, God pours out His finest gifts, graces and blessings upon us!

St. Paul understood this concept and preached it to the people of Corinth: "The point is this: he who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must do as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (2 Cor. 9:6-7)

Ultimately it is each person's individual choice to give or to not give; we have been endowed with the gift of free will. I hope you will prayerfully consider giving to Radio Maria USA to help us propagate the message of the Gospel and the messages of Our Lady at her many apparitions around the world.

There is only one place in all the scriptures of the entire bible that God says, "Test me on this". It is in the book of Malachi. The Lord is speaking to the Israelites, and He says to them that they are robbing Him. When they ask God how they are robbing Him, God replies, "in your tithes and offerings". Then the

Lord says, "Bring the full tithes into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house; and thereby put me to the test, says the LORD of hosts, if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you an overflowing blessing." (Mal. 3:10)

God offers us a different perspective on giving. It is not one of last resort and compounded with guilt, but one filled with abundance, freedom, and joy. It is the ancient model of tithing. Tithing can help us take a step toward achieving a God-honoring balance with our financial resources.

I have adopted this principle in my own life; I tithe 10% of my gross income to the church and various charities. God has always provided new money back to me in the most unusual and interesting ways. He is always faithful and dependable.

For many of us, we make choices about food, housing, relationships, employment, recreation, and transportation -- to name a few -- before we make choices about monetary gifts to the

church and to charitable organizations. Our lifestyle and all of its financial requirements take precedence over our obligation to share financial resources.

The decision of defining how much is enough for our lifestyle is a difficult one. As Christians, we are called constantly to balance between our desired wants and our perceived needs. We need to return to the discipline of living simply, just as the Holy Family lived. The necessities of life are important. The luxuries of life are often not important in the scope of salvation; or worse yet, can be barriers to eternal life when excessively abused.

The ways in which we choose to earn, give, save, and spend money are ultimately spiritual decisions. When our first decision is one of giving, we place a greater level of trust in God. We begin by saying, "Thank you God! All that we have received is a blessing from you." We acknowledge that we worship God and not money! Giving frees us from the bondage that money can have over our lives.

May the Lord continue to bless you abundantly as we move through Lent and approach the great celebration of the resurrection of Jesus this Easter!

March 19 -- Solemnity of St. Joseph

Scripture says St. Joseph was a 'just' man

We know very little about Saint Joseph, except that he was the husband of Mary and foster-father of Jesus. Scripture calls him a "just" man.

By saying Joseph was "just," the Bible means that he was one who was completely open to all that God wanted to do for him. He became holy by opening himself totally to God.

The rest we can easily surmise. Think of the kind of love with which he wooed and won Mary, and the depth of the love they shared during their marriage.

It is no contradiction of Joseph's manly holiness that he decided to divorce



Mary when she was found to be with child. The important words of the Bible are that he planned to do this "quietly" because he was "a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame" (Matthew 1:19).

The just man simply, joyfully, wholeheartedly obedient to God—in marrying Mary, in naming

Jesus, in shepherding the precious pair to Egypt, in bringing them to Nazareth, in the undetermined number of years of quiet faith and courage.

Reflection

The Bible tells us nothing of Joseph in the years after the return to Nazareth except the incident of finding Jesus in the Temple (Luke 2:41–51). Perhaps this can be taken to mean that God wants us to realize that the holiest family was like every other family, that the circumstances of life for the holiest family were like those of every family, so that when Jesus' mysterious nature began to appear, people couldn't believe that he came from such humble beginnings: "Is he not the carpenter's son? Is not his mother named Mary...?" (Matthew 13:55a).

Our Lady's Little Stones: Fasting on Bread and Water

Fasting on "bread and water," is one of the five "little stones" Our Lady has given us from her messages in Medjugorje.

If you are new to the reference of "little stones," they refer to five spiritual weapons Our Lady has given us to fight the good fight against Satan. As God gave David little stones which he used to hurl at Goliath, we are to do likewise in our spiritual battle against our Goliath, the Evil One.

Our Lady's request is to fast on Wednesdays and Fridays, on bread and water from midnight to midnight; that is, the entire day, "The best fast is on bread and water. Through fasting and prayer one can stop wars, one can suspend the natural laws of nature. Works of charity cannot replace fasting. Everyone except the sick, has to fast." (July 21, 1982)

In these modern times that we live in, it seems so rare to hear of people fasting in the manner in which Our Lady asks of us.

How to fast on bread and water for beginners

Fasting has always been a part of Lent and Our Lady has asked us to fast on bread and water on Wednesdays and Fridays. But do we do it?

Fasting is hard. No one likes to fast -- especially on just bread and water. But if you would like to try, here are a few tips that might help you get started.

1. Start gradually. Begin fasting on bread and water for one meal at a time. Then two meals. Then the whole day.

2. Pray. We forgo food to grow closer to God, not to show how tough we can be on our bodies. The hunger we experience while fasting instills in us the truth that nothing in this world can satisfy us but God alone.

3. Temptations. You will undergo many temptations while you fast. Satan hates for us to fast. Replace temptations with an activity like prayer, going for a walk, or calling someone on the phone.

If you are new to fasting and wondering about whether or not this is something you can do, it is not difficult or strenuous at all. Fasting is done out of love for Our Lady and performed as an offering to God. Well motivated in this respect makes the days of fasting a great joy, knowing that you are pleasing both God and Our Lady.

Fasting benefits us in many ways, physically and psychologically, but it is the spiritual benefits that should

concern us the most. What we should also consider is that when we fast, combined with prayer, there is an even greater opportunity to receive God's mercy upon us.

By combining fasting with prayer, we increase the power of our prayers. This is something we should keep in mind especially when praying for a special or urgent intention. By fasting we allow our entire being to participate and offer this sacrifice to God. Let us also not forget that Jesus fasted frequently and he taught the Apostles, that certain devils can be cast out in no other way except by prayer and fasting. (Mark 9:29)

The amount of bread and water you consume does not matter, so long as you make the sacrifice of this strict fast and offer it to God.

By giving our assent to Our Lady to fast, combined with prayer, we may come to know God's love and do His Will in our lives:

Fasting and prayer form that perfect combination in

our fight against evil. We pray better when we fast, and our love for our Saviour and Redeemer grows. Fasting also heightens our receptivity to listen inwardly to God's gentle voice.

The Evil One hates fasting and tries to discourage us. Saint Paul used to fast before his journeys to clear the way of all devils from his path.

It cures diseases; it dries up all morbid discharges of the body. It repels devils and drives out unclean thoughts. It renders the spirit more lucid and purifies the heart. It sanctifies the body and transports man to God's throne. Fasting is a powerful force and leads to great spiritual triumphs.

It should be noted that there are exceptions to the strict fasting of bread and water: in the case of small children; the elderly; and those who are of temporarily ill or have a serious health issue, are not asked to adhere to the strict fast.

Our Lady Queen of Peace, pray for us.

But it quickly grew in popularity into other countries. Radio Maria began broadcasting from its first English-speaking station in the US on May 25, 2000 in Alexandria, La. It has since expanded to include 11 frequencies in six other states.
