To see Your face, and be restored.

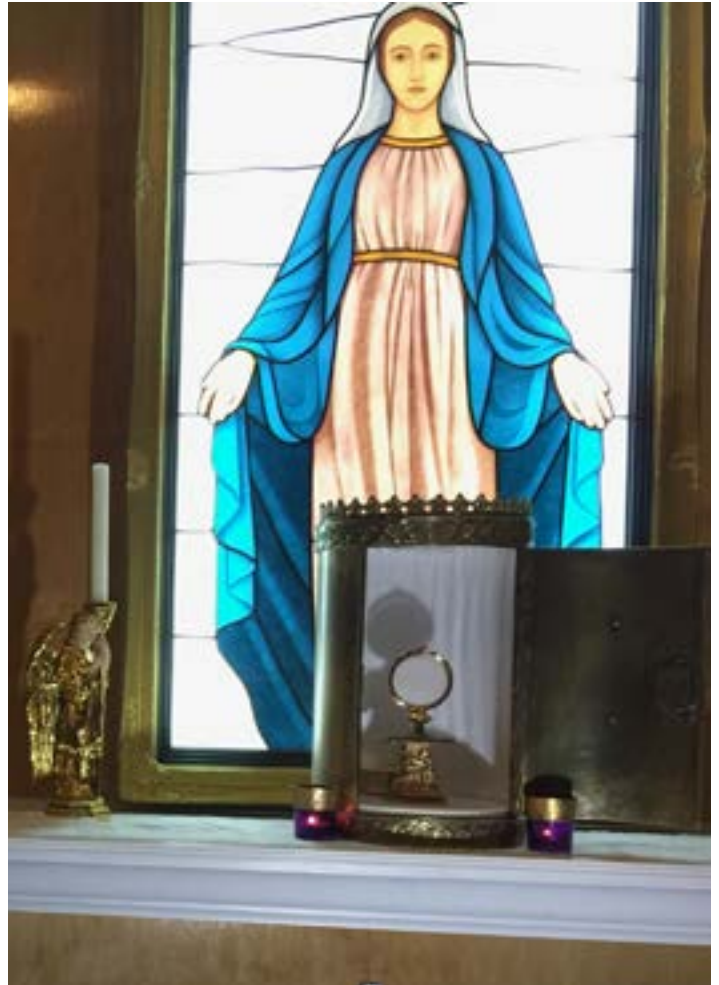

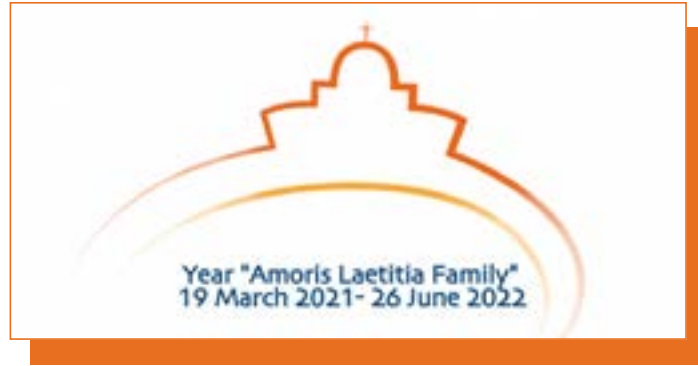

March 19 begins Year “Amoris Laetitia Family”

CNA - Pope Francis announced that March 19, 2021 - June 26, 2022, has been named Year “Amoris Laetitia Family,” a year dedicated to the family.

It also marks the 5th anniversary of the publication of his apostolic exhortation *Amoris laetitia* (The Joy of Love), addressing the pastoral care of families.

“As of now, I invite everyone to take part in the initiatives that will be promoted during the Year and that will be coordinated by the Dicastery for Laity, Family, and Life. Let us entrust this journey, with families all over the world, to the Holy Family of Nazareth, in particular to St. Joseph, the devoted spouse and father.”



Yes, it is also the Year of St. Joseph, which began on Dec. 8, 2020, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, and will end on Dec. 8, 2021.

In a press conference about the Amoris Laetitia Year, Cardinal Kevin Farrell, head of the Dicastery for Laity, Family, and Life said “it was providential that the Holy Father dedicated this year to St. Joseph, husband and fa-

ther, who was so loved that he was chosen by God to care for the Holy Family.”

“The family remains forever ‘guardian’ of our most authentic and original relationships, those that are born in love and make us mature as people,” he said.

“Through the spiritual, pastoral, and cultural initiatives planned in the Year ‘Amoris Laetitia Family,’ Pope Francis intends to address all ecclesial communities throughout the world, exhorting each person to be a witness of family love.”

Resources

“Resources will be shared within parishes, dioceses, universities, and in the context of ecclesial movements and family associations, on: family spirituality, formation and pastoral activity for marriage preparation, young people education in affective maturity, and on the holiness of married couples and families who live out the grace of the sacrament in their daily life.”

Symposiums

“International academic symposiums will be organized to examine in-depth the contents and implications of the apostolic exhortation in relation to highly topical issues that affect families around the world.”

Website

The dicastery also announced the creation of a new website, www.amorislaetitia.va, dedicated to the year, which will end on June 26, 2022, with the celebration of the 10th World Meeting of Families in Rome.

Brochure

An “informational brochure” would be available on the site, which currently redirects to the dicastery’s homepage.

Among the initiatives announced in the brochure are a forum to be held June 9-12, 2021, titled “Where are we with *Amoris laetitia*? Strategies for implementing the apostolic exhortation of Pope Francis.”

Video Project

The brochure also said that Pope Francis would take part in a project called “10 Videos Amoris Laetitia” in which he would “explain the chapters of the apostolic exhortation, along with families who will give witness by sharing some aspects of their daily lives.” The videos will appear monthly.

Two films coming out April 2, Good Friday

Roe v. Wade, co-written and co-directed by Nick Loeb and Cathy Allyn, is set to premiere April 2 in select theatres nationwide and on Amazon Prime and iTunes.

Loeb, a businessman-turned-filmmaker and actor, plays the part of Dr. Bernard Nathanson, a prolific abortion doctor who later converted to Christianity and became pro-life.

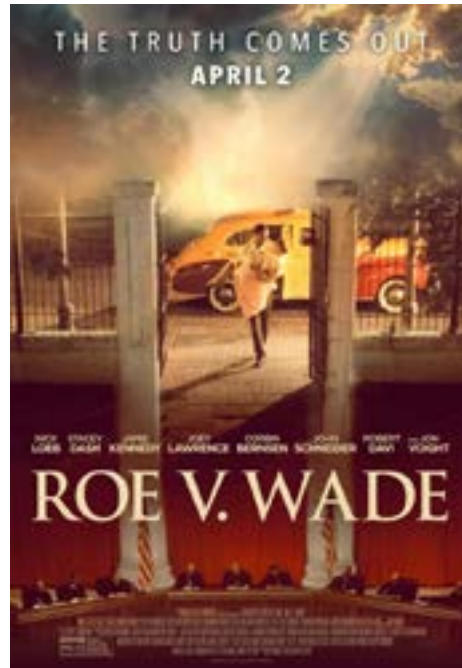
Loeb recently said that despite the film's subject matter, it is not a "conservative," "religious," or even a "pro-life" film.

"What we tried to do is really just lay out the facts of how *Roe v. Wade* came to be and how it was decided. People can take one view or another."

Still, Loeb himself is pro-life and the personal journey of Loeb's character, Nathanson, is one of powerful pro-life conversion.

"Why some folks may think it's a conservative film or why it aligns with those views is because the protagonist actually converts. He starts off pro-choice and becomes pro-life through his journey. It's a true story," Loeb commented.

Nathanson personally per-



formed an estimated 5,000 abortions and oversaw tens of thousands more, including one on his own pregnant girlfriend in the 1960s.

Nathanson was previously a strong proponent of legalized abortion, and has been accused of inflating statistics on illegal abortions in the U.S. In 1969, he helped to found the lobbying organization now known as NARAL Pro-Choice

America. He left the practice of abortion in the early 1970s, and became a Christian and a pro-life activist until his death in 2011.

Loeb said he experienced an evolution of his own views on abortion similar to that of Nathanson. As a young man, he was pro-choice; in his 20s, he had two partners who obtained abortions.

"Learning more about the science behind it and when a human being is actually created, I slowly started to change my views. I went on the same journey as Nathanson.

"I really want people to understand, whether they're pro-choice or pro-life, that when a woman gets pregnant, there's a baby there," he said. "It's not a clump of cells or a gob of goo. There's a real living being that has a heartbeat in the first couple of weeks that you can hear. People should understand that so they don't take abortion so lightly."

The Unholy will be released one day only in theatres -- Good Friday. Critics are saying the storyline parallels the events at Medjugorje, but with an evil twist.

Producer, Sam Raimi, with the production of several horror movies under his belt, promotes the movie with the phrase, "Be careful who you pray to."

The *Unholy* portrays a deaf-mute girl who is cured one night when she runs to a big tree behind her parish church. Of course, for more blasphemy, the church is named after St. Joseph. There are miracle cures in front of the tree when the Virgin Mary appears.

Their "village" explodes with



publicity that spreads the story far and wide, even to many countries. But then terrifying events begin to happen all around. What was said to be apparitions of the Virgin Mary, becomes something more sinister.

This movie is diabolical itself. Satan plans to hijack, water down and taint the credibility of the purpose of the Secrets by painting

the Medjugorje apparitions as diabolical.

A statue of Our Lady of Medjugorje is used throughout the movie.

Radio Maria was born as a parish radio in 1983 in the Diocese of Milan, Italy. Its purpose was to keep parishioners informed and to help them through prayer, the daily Mass and the Rosary. But it quickly grew in popularity into other countries. Radio Maria began broadcasting from its first English-speaking station in the US on May 25, 2000 in Alexandria, La. It has since expanded to include 11 frequencies in six other states.
