



4 things to know about the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary on August 15

The Assumption of Mary's body and soul into Heaven, celebrated on August 15, is one of the dogmas of the Church. A dogma is a belief held by all Catholics.

Yet, there is no mention of Mary's Assumption in Sacred Scripture.

How then, did we come to believe that this event took place?

1. When did the Assumption of Mary become dogma?

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII in *Munificentissimus Deus* (The Most Bountiful God) said: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory." Notice that he says "having completed the course of her earthly life." That leaves it open to interpretation whether Mary died before she was assumed into Heaven or not.

2. Ancient belief in the Assumption

From early on, it was clear that there were no relics of Mary. There was an empty tomb in Jerusalem which quickly became a place of pilgrimage. There are also stories from early Apostolic Tradition and quotes from early Christian letters

and sermons that point us toward the Assumption of Mary. The feast of the "Memory of Mary" is one of the earliest Marian feasts and was celebrated as early as the 300s.

"If therefore it might come to pass by the power of your grace, it has appeared right to us your servants that, as you, having overcome death, do reign in glory, so you should raise up the body of your Mother and take her with you, rejoicing, into heaven. Then said the Savior [Jesus]: "Be it done according to your will"

(The Passing of the Virgin 16:2-17 [A.D. 300]). -Timothy of Jerusalem

3. Differences in the Eastern and Western Churches

The Eastern Churches celebrate the feast as the "Dormition

of the Mother of God". "Dormition" means "falling asleep" and refers to Mary's death. Art in the Western Church usually depicts the Assumption with Mary going up to Heaven while still alive, although there are a few pieces which also show her funeral. Ultimately, whether or not she was alive at the time is unimportant. We only need to know that she was assumed body and soul into Heaven.

4. How is Mary's Assumption different from Jesus' Ascension?

Jesus, because He is God, ascended into Heaven by His own power. Only God can do that. Mary was assumed into Heaven by God. She was not able to do it on her own.

Fr. Aleksey gives update of Radio Maria in Ukraine

Hello, I am Father Aleksey, director of Radio Maria Ukraine. Currently I'm not in Kiev, I'm not in the Radio Maria studio. I am in the city of Trostianets, in the north of Ukraine, about 30 km from the border with Russia.

Right behind me is the hospital. This city has been occupied by Russian forces for over a month and we have come here to do a series of interviews with the people who have survived this difficult time under Russian occupation. I have already heard horrible stories.

Today I spoke with the mayor of this city, and I asked him where I could go to shoot these videos for Radio Maria Italy and World Family of Radio Maria, and he directed me to this place. This hospital was built six months ago, it's practically new. Almost in tears, he told me that everything inside has been destroyed. The purpose of this video is to help us understand what the situation is in Ukraine now.

So many regions have been destroyed, where the Russians have been. For me this city, this hospital is the essence of Radio Maria's mission because so many people here in

Ukraine are full of wounds. The mayor told me the city is not the same anymore. People are wounded, they have lost their homes, friends, relatives. The mission of Radio Maria, in this difficult situation, is to bring the good news of the Gospel, to give hope, to give light, to give meaning to life.

How is Radio Maria managing now? It will soon be six months since the war started. We have some news. Some of our radio towers were destroyed but now they are working again. Luckily, they have been repaired. Last week we received news from Kharkiv (a city still half occupied by Russian forces). They told us that the tower had been repaired and now we can broadcast there. We have also been contacted by the gov-

ernment with a proposal to increase the capacity of our transmitter located in the south of Ukraine, in Zaporizhia. Thus, they will be able to listen to Radio Maria not only in that city, but also in Kherson, a city in the central region currently occupied by the Russians.

Radio Maria will therefore broadcast in that city, and I think that for many people this will be very important.

We've also been asked us to broadcast on national TV and radio platforms on the Internet. Radio Maria will therefore be included in the bundle with all these radio and TV stations. In a sense, this is good news. Our employees are also slowly returning. Almost all staff are back. We can work more or less as normal. Our volunteers are back too, not all of them for now, but I hope that at the end of August we will be able to resume our programmes as normal. We continue to pray. Recently we celebrated the national holiday of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. This year it was not possible to organise, as usual, a big celebration with many people gathering in the squares to celebrate Mass with many guests. This year Mass was celebrated underground.

USCCB launches 3-year Eucharistic Revival

Only 31% of Catholics believe in True Presence of Christ in Eucharist

The National Eucharistic Revival was launched June 19, 2022 on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, or Corpus Christi. It has a mission to “renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist,”

Sponsored by the U.S. bishops, the revival aims to inspire people to encounter Jesus in the Eucharist.

What is the Eucharistic Revival?

The Eucharistic Revival is a three-year initiative that aims to inspire, educate, and unite. In a world where not many people know Jesus intimately, the revival is meant to show everyone what wonders the True Presence of Jesus can do to heal the soul. Through a carefully planned timeline of events, after three years, the U.S. bishops hope to change the lives of many Catholics and non-Catholics alike.

Why are U.S. bishops doing this?

The current world is hurting and straying far from God. According to Pew Research Center, only 31% of Catholics even believe in the True Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. It is up to that 31% to spread the truth to all. As the revival website says, “We all need healing, yet many of us are separated from the very source of our strength. Jesus Christ invites us to return to the source and summit of our faith — his Real Presence in the Holy Eucharist.”

It is a time to confront the hardships that face people in everyday life. The National Eucharistic Revival is a powerful, uplifting way to rise to this challenge.

The initiative will be take place over three years:



**National Eucharistic Revival
June 19, 2022 - July 21, 2025**

Year of Diocesan Revival

June 19, 2022 – June 11, 2023

This first year of the Revival invites diocesan staff, bishops, and priests to promote and inspire understanding of the Eucharist. The training of “eucharistic missionaries” will come through online and in-person resources that teach about Christ and the Real Presence.

Year of Parish Revival

June 11, 2023 – July 17, 2024

The second phase will foster Eucharistic devotion at the parish level, strengthening our liturgical life through faithful celebration of the Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, missions, resources, preaching, and organic movements of the Holy Spirit.

National Eucharistic Congress

July 17 – 21, 2024

At this historic event, more than 80,000 Catholics of all ages will gather in Indianapolis, Indiana to reconsecrate their hearts to the source and summit of our faith.

How can I get involved?

There are many ways for individuals all over the United States to get involved in the National Eucharistic Revival.

Catholics are given the option to become prayer partners, share testimonies, and call on the Holy Spirit to encourage and strengthen this movement. The revival calls upon “lay people, families, religious orders, and priests to volunteer their time, talents, and prayers in pursuit of the grassroots renewal our world so desperately needs.”

Available learning resources include Corpus Christi novenas in both English and Spanish, a document prepared by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) about the Eucharist, a question and answer page about the Eucharist, and a free course by Bishop Andrew H. Cozzens of the Archdiocese of Crookston on learning to embrace the gift of the Eucharist. More resources will become available throughout the movement’s timeline.

Not only does it have an abundance of learning resources and prayer assistance, but also a list of answered frequently asked questions. The USCCB website (usccb.org) also has a wealth of resources.

Little children, I am with you also in these days when Satan is fighting for war and hatred.

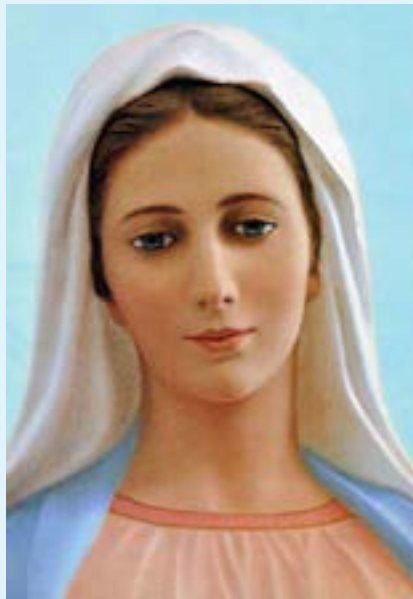

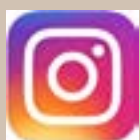

Radio Maria was born as a parish radio in 1983 in the Diocese of Milan, Italy. Its purpose was to keep parishioners informed and to help them through prayer, the daily Mass and the Rosary. It quickly grew in popularity expanding into a worldwide radio network. Radio Maria began broadcasting from its first English-speaking station in the US on May 25, 2000 in Alexandria, La. It has since expanded into the Radio Maria USA National Network of 12 radio stations in 8 states.
